

The Summary of the Law

First Lesson: Isaiah 42:1-9

- 1 Behold my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my Spirit upon Him; He will bring forth justice to the nations.
- 2 He will not cry aloud or lift up His voice, or make it heard in the street;
- 3 a bruised reed He will not break, and a faintly burning wick He will not quench; He will faithfully bring forth justice.
- 4 He will not grow faint or be discouraged till He has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his law.
- 5 Thus says God, the Lord, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people on it and spirit to those who walk in it:
- 6 "I am the Lord; I have called you in righteousness; I will take you by the hand and keep you; will give you as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations,
- 7 to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.
- 8 I am the Lord; that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to carved idols.
- 9 Behold, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth I tell you of them."

4 John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.

5 And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

6 Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey.

7 And he preached, saying, "After me comes He who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie.

8 I have baptized you with water, but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

9 In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan.

10 And when He came up out of the water, immediately He saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit descending on Him like a dove.

Renewal of Baptismal Vows

Through the Paschal mystery, dear friends, we are buried with Christ by Baptism into His death, and raised with Him to newness of life. I call upon you, therefore, to renew the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced the devil and all his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in His one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

Celebrant Do you, here in the presence of God and the Church, renew the solemn promises and vows made at your Baptism and commit yourself to keep them?

People *I do.*

Celebrant Do you renounce the devil and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

People *I renounce them.*

Celebrant Do you renounce the empty promises and deadly deceits of this world that corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

People *I renounce them.*

Celebrant Do you renounce the sinful desires of the flesh that draw you from the love of God?

People *I renounce them.*

Celebrant Do you turn to Jesus Christ and confess Him as your Lord and Savior?

People *I do.*

Celebrant Do you joyfully receive the Christian Faith, as revealed in the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?

People *I do.*

Question Will you obediently keep God's holy will and commandments, and walk in them all the days of your life?

People *I will, the Lord being my helper.*

Let us now reaffirm our faith in the words of the ancient baptismal confession, the Apostles' Creed.

Celebrant Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

People *I do.*

I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Celebrant Do you believe and trust in Jesus Christ?

People *I do.*

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead.

On the third day He rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

*And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory,
forever and ever. Amen.*

The Fraction

Priest: Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

People: *Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.*

The Ministration of Communion

The gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you and feed on Him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

At this time the congregation is invited to come forward to receive the consecrated wafer after it has been dipped in the wine. The priest will drop it into your hand and you are to take it back to your seat to be consumed. If you prefer not to come forward, you may consume the consecrated wafer you received upon entering the sanctuary.

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The Prayer for Spiritual Communion - *(for those unable to receive the sacrament at this time)*

Dear Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Holy Sacrament.

I love you above all things, and I desire to possess you within my soul, and since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I beseech you to come spiritually into my heart.

I unite myself to you, together with all your faithful people, gathered around every altar of your Church, and I embrace you with all the affections of my soul.

Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

By His resurrection He broke the bonds of death, trampling Hell and Satan under His feet. As our great high priest, He ascended to your right hand in glory, that we might come with confidence before the throne of grace.

On the night that He was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Priest and People

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

The Prayer of Consecration

The People remain standing or kneel. The Priest continues:

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and when we had sinned against you and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent your only Son into the world for our salvation. By the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary He became flesh and dwelt among us. In obedience to your will, He stretched out His arms upon the cross and offered Himself once for all, that by His suffering and death we might be saved.

e Priest continues:

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, and we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Word and Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Sanctify us also, that we may worthily receive this holy sacrament, and be made one body with Him, so that He may dwell in us and we in Him. And bring us with all your saints into the fullness of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By Him, and with Him, and in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. **AMEN.**

The Lord's Prayer

Priest: And now as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name.

Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

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Celebrant Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

People ***I do.***

***I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen.***

Let us pray.

Almighty God, you have built your Church upon the foundation of the Apostles and Prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone: Grant us so to be joined together in unity of spirit by their doctrine, that we may be made a holy temple acceptable to you; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. **Amen.**

Prayers of the People

For the peace of the whole world, and for the well-being and unity of the people of God.

Reader: Lord, in your mercy,

For our brothers and sisters in Christ who are persecuted for their faith.

Reader: Lord, in your mercy,

People: ***hear our prayer.***

For our nation, for those in authority and for all in public service [*especially N., our President*].

Reader: Lord, in your mercy,

People: ***hear our prayer.***

For all those who are in trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity.

Reader: I invite you to silently add your own requests at this time.

People: ***hear our prayer.***

For all those who have departed this life in the certain hope of the resurrection [especially _____].

Reader: Lord, in your mercy,

People: **hear our prayer.**

The Priest concludes with the following prayer:

Heavenly Father, grant these our prayers for Jesus Christ's sake, our only Mediator and Advocate, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

The Confession and Absolution of Sin

Priest: Let us humbly confess our sins to Almighty God.

Silence.

The Clergy and People kneel, as able, and pray:

Most merciful God,

we confess that we have sinned against you

in thought, word and deed,

by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

We have not loved you with our whole heart;

we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.

We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,

have mercy on us and forgive us;

that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways,

to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who in His great mercy has promised forgiveness of sins to all those who sincerely repent and with true faith turn to Him, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and bring you to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
